#### **Summer Enrichment**

- While some teachers from each grade level are working on curriculum maps, the remaining teachers are meeting virtually to work on Summer Enrichment activities
- We are using choice boards in grades PK – 8, but we are looking for creative learning opportunities that are more hands on, real life learning activities that will keep brains sharp over the summer,
- K-5 teachers are also recording instructional read alouds, which will be shared over the summer.

#### **Curriculum Mapping**

- Teachers from each grade level and school in grades K – 5 are in the process of working on next year's curriculum maps for each content area.
- Content teachers in grades 6-12 are also working on their curriculum maps.
- Plans are being made to incorporate some review, but there is a sense of urgency to accomplish as much of the power standards as possible due to possible closures next year.
